


On 25th March 2014, classes I & II were taken to Lake Mist.

In the second division of classes VIII and IX the winners






Waverley has always worked on the principle of discipline and sought to build students who are not only scholars but also who are obedient, kind and generous

DISASTER MANAGEMENT


