




Open Days-2015

Mini Fete 01 May 2015



This day, dedicated only to teachers made them realize how they have occupied a special place in the hearts of every student. All



hearts. Everyone then settled down to enjoy the hot coffee and snacks being served by the gracious girls of class XII.






They arrived in school at 1 a.m. thoroughly exhausted but euphoric after the experience of a lifetime.
